

The National Property Draw Animal Funding Guidelines

Please ensure you read the following guidelines carefully before applying for funding from The National Property Draw. Only eligible applications will be considered. Please keep these guidelines for your own record as they may be updated over time.

The National Property Draw invite applications for funding which are then reviewed against specific criteria in accordance with the objectives of the company.

The objectives of The National Property Draw are

- ❖ To benefit animals
- ❖ To protect animals
- ❖ To relieve animals of suffering
- ❖ To develop the understanding of animals
- ❖ To support the partnership of humans and animals

Applicants must be registered with the Charity Commission for England and Wales or the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator.

Each application is considered based on the Charities financial position, performance against charitable aims and objectives, the ratio of voluntary income against fundraising expenses and the overall suitability of the Charity.

The National Property Draw will not support funding applications from or for

- ❖ Individuals
- ❖ Any Unregistered Charity
- ❖ Charities registered outside the United Kingdom
- ❖ Charities that have not been established for more than 3 financial years
- ❖ Charities unable to provide a full set of their most recent Annual Reports & Accounts
- ❖ Any Charity with a legacy income of more than £1,000,000 per year
- ❖ Any Charity with a fundraising income of more than £1,000,000 per year
- ❖ Charities that operate a destruction policy
- ❖ Charities with cash and/or investments valued at more than one year's expenditure will not qualify for a donation unless it can be demonstrated that reserves are being held specifically for a project
- ❖ PR and marketing campaign costs
- ❖ Activities that are not animal welfare related
- ❖ For goods or services bought before funding is confirmed i.e. funding is not available retrospectively

All applications meeting the following criteria are welcome to apply

- ❖ Be a Charity registered in the UK
- ❖ Be Independently examined and hold up to date annual accounts.
- ❖ Demonstrate an active re-homing and rehabilitation policy for animals taken into their care.
- ❖ Those encouraging initiatives designed to improve animal welfare.
- ❖ Those encouraging initiatives designed to improve animal and human partnerships
- ❖ Those promoting and practicing practical work to alleviate suffering and prevent cruelty to animals

Funding will be considered for the following charitable purposes

- ❖ General running costs associated with the rescue, rehabilitation, re-homing & release of animals
- ❖ Assistance with veterinary fees
- ❖ The purchase of Land, Buildings, or equipment
- ❖ The purchase of transportation vehicles
- ❖ Salaries for general running costs associated with rescue, rehabilitation, re-homing & release of animals not including managers or director's salaries

What happens next?

If your charity is being considered for funding, we will contact you for further information on your charity. Requests for further information does not guarantee your application has been successful. If we decide to proceed with your charity you may be asked to attend a face to face meeting or we will request a visit at your charity's headquarters. If you are being offered potential funding, once you have acknowledged you are happy with our terms and conditions you will be sent our formal charity agreement, the agreement is binding and non-negotiable and you will have been considered to accept the agreement once you have signed and returned the formal charity agreement to us.

While we carefully and sympathetically consider all applications that meet our criteria, it is not possible to either give reasons why applications have not been successful or enter into any dialogue or correspondence regarding an applications status. If your application is being considered, you should expect to hear back within 1 month of your initial application date.

A Funding Acceptance Form must be completed and returned before any monies will be released. Failure to return the Funding Acceptance Form within seven working days of receipt will result in the offer of funding being withdrawn. Any project supported by The National Property Draw must be monitored and evaluated and a quarterly report must be sent outlining the progress that the Charity is making with the funds it was allocated. Full terms and conditions will be made available to successful applicants.

Each application is considered based on the Charities financial position, performance against charitable aims and objectives, the ratio of voluntary income against fundraising expenses and the overall suitability of the Charity.

The National Property Draw will not support funding applications from or for

- ❖ Individuals
- ❖ Any Unregistered Charity
- ❖ Charities registered outside the United Kingdom
- ❖ Charities that have not been established for more than 3 financial years
